## Rx

Next Steps—if you were to teach this lesson again or conduct this activity again, what changes would you make?

- 1. In order to avoid the P.E. problem, I should have closed the window blinds prior to the students coming into the classroom.
  - A) This will involve talking with Mr. Pinkerman before my period begins.
  - B) This problem could have also been avoided if I always kept my windows closed.
- 2. In order to avoid the students not looking at the lesson plan to see what to do next (instead of asking me during the test) I should have practiced the skill more often with the students earlier in the year.
  - This year I focused on practicing behavior expectations more often than testing expectations. I should have practiced all of my expectations more often earlier in the semester.
- 3. Unfortunately, even with all of the behavior practice I had worked on with the students this year, they do tend to get excited and talk out of turn. I made a point to take away points from the students at the end of the class period and let them know it was due to



talking out of turn.

In the future, I need to do a better job of managing the behavior in my classroom.

4. While I have improved my classroom management skills since the beginning of the year, I still have improvements that can be made on my classroom transitions and the voice level in my classroom.
